**Subject:- Grant of Conditional Permission to Dronacharya Ayurvedic Educational Institute & Hospital, Khushalipur, Shakumbari Devi Road, Distt. Saharanpur-247662, Uttar Pradesh (AYU0551) with 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course for the academic session 2023-24 under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder-reg.**

Sir/Madam,

With reference to the subject mentioned above, I am directed to inform you that in pursuance of the provision of National commission for Indian System of Medicine Act, 2020, the Indian Medicine Central Council Act, 1970 (48 of 1970) has been repealed with effect from the 11th day of June, 2021. With effect from the said date, the Central Council of Indian Medicine constituted under sub-division (1) of section 3 of the Indian Medicine Central Council Act, 1970 (48 of 1970) shall stand dissolved. Now, in exercise of the powers conferred by sub-section (3) of the section 1 of the said Act, the Central Government hereby notifies that all the provisions of the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine Act, 2020 has been come into force with effect from the 11th day of June, 2021 and as per regulation 59 (2) of The National Commission for Indian System of Medicine ACT, 2020, Medical standards, requirements and other provisions of the Indian Medicine Central Council Act, 1970 and the rules and regulations made there under shall continue to be in force and operate till new standards or requirements are specified under this Act or the rules and regulations made there under. Further, the provision of concerned regulations which are inconsistent with the provision of NCISM Act, 2020 shall not be applicable.

1. Further, to assess the available facilities of teaching, non-teaching, Hospital staff, practical training and other infrastructure facilities at your college namely **Dronacharya Ayurvedic Educational Institute & Hospital, Khushalipur, Shakumbari Devi Road, Distt. Saharanpur-247662, Uttar Pradesh (AYU0551)** inspection of your College was conducted **on 22.05.2023 & 23.05.2023 on hybrid mode** as a part of annual visitation by the visitation team of Medical Assessment and Rating Board, NCISM to process **the Conditional permission with 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course for the academic session 2023-24 under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020.**
2. Further, in view of above, the visitation report and all other related documents were assessed in terms of enforced regulation namely the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for under-graduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016" and provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations there under. **On examining the same certain deficiencies were observed by the Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM).**
3. As per the direction of President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM), the assessment report was placed in the **48<sup>th</sup> Board Meeting** of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) held **on 20.07.2023**. On careful examination of the assessment report it was found that **your college is not fulfilling the notified & approved criteria for issuance of Conditional permission with 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course for the academic session 2023-24** and Board decided to provide an opportunity of hearing to your college. Accordingly, the hearing was conducted on **04.08.2023** to present the case through virtual mode.
4. The observation of hearing committee based on the submission made by the college representatives during hearing and assessment report of the NCISM have been carefully re-examined in terms of the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for under-graduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016", provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder, and once again as per the direction of President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM), the recommendation of Hearing Committee was placed **in the 51<sup>th</sup> Board meeting** of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) **on 08.08.2023**. Board verified the same and decided to issue **Conditional permission with 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course under section 28 of the NCISM Act, 2020 with a warning, for the academic session 2023-24.**
5. Therefore, **Conditional Permission is granted to Dronacharya Ayurvedic Educational Institute & Hospital, Khushalipur, Shakumbari Devi Road, Distt. Saharanpur-247662, Uttar Pradesh (AYU0551)**

with **60 seats in UG (BAMS) course under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020** and relevant regulations thereunder, **with a warning** on the following shortcomings and subject to fulfilment of the following conditions:-

**A. Shortcoming:-**

I. In the college the following details are not available:-

- II. OPD case papers are not maintained properly.
- III. There is no numbering of beds and the department wise bed numbers are not displayed at the entrance of the Wards.
- IV. Wards don't have attached toilet and bathroom facility.
- V. There are no columns in the birth register to mention OPD & IPD numbers.
- VI. Only one computer (with out Internet) is found in the central library.
- VII. Temporary Paper printed boards were used in many wings instead of the Permanent Boards.
- VIII. There is no separate OPD for Eye and ENT.
- IX. Only one common room was found without attached toilet. Separate Common rooms are not available for Ladies and Gents.
- X. In Rasashashtra department no Putas found and it was under construction.
- XI. During the time of visitation, the quality control room was shown in the Museum itself.
- XII. Pharmacognosy Lab is found in the museum itself. It needs a separate partition or room.

**B. Conditions:-**

- I. The college shall submit an undertaking in the form of affidavit duly notarized within one month explaining the details of providing EPF and ESI facilities to the teaching, non-teaching staff of the colleges/hospitals and regularly paying the same as per the provisions of Employees' Provident Funds and Miscellaneous Provisions Act, 1952 & ESI Act, 1948 and relevant rules and regulations.
- II. It is further informed that minimum 15% of undergraduate seats of the permitted intake capacity **with 60 seats** shall be treated as All India Quota. The counseling for seats under All India Quota shall be conducted by respective counseling authority as designated by Central Government for A.Y. 2023-24 and counseling for the remaining 85% seats or as the case may be, shall be conducted by the concerned counseling authority of that State/UT. **The permission of the college stands withdrawn if the college fails to comply with the aforesaid direction of the Central Government/NCISM for All India Quota or the students admitted thereunder.**
- III. It is also informed that determination of fee and all other charges in respect of 50% of seats in private Medical Institutions and deemed to be University should be as per the guidelines issued by NCISM vide ref no.BUSS/Fee/ASU/2022-23 dated 16.09.2022. Fees of the remaining 50% of seats are to be fixed as per the guidelines of Fee Fixation/Regulatory Committee (FRC) of respective State/UT/Deemed to be University.
- 6. Admissions made in violation of the above conditions will be treated as invalid and action will be initiated under NCISM Act & Regulations thereunder.
- 7. Discrepancies, if any, may be immediately brought to the notice of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine, NCISM.
- 8. **The following requirements should be fulfilled by the college by 31<sup>st</sup> December, 2023 and send a compliance report to get permission for the session 2024-25: -**
  - i) All the requirements of Minimum Standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in Regulation 3 of the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for under-graduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016;
  - ii) All the requirements of the Indian Medicine Central Council (Minimum Standards of Education in Indian Medicine) Amendment Regulations, 2016 (for Ayurveda).
  - iii) All the requirements under the provisions of the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations made thereunder should be fulfilled in toto.
  - iv) All the shortcomings as mentioned above in **point no. 5. A.**
- 9. The fulfillment of the conditions given above may be made within the time period specified and compliance report should be submitted by the college to President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of

Medicine. The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine will verify that the conditions have been fulfilled for considering the permission for the academic session 2024-25.
