Subject:- Grant of Yearly Permission to Dronacharya Ayurvedic Educational Institute & Hospital, Khushalipur, Shakumbari Devi Road, Distt. Saharanpur-247662, Uttar Pradesh (Inst. Id-AYU0551) with intake capacity of intake capacity of 57 seats [instead of 60 seats] in UG (BAMS) course for the academic session 2025-26 under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 reg.

Sir/Madam,

- To assess the available facilities of teaching, non-teaching, hospital staff, practical training and other infrastructure facilities at your college namely **Dronacharya Ayurvedic Educational Institute & Hospital, Khushalipur, Shakumbari Devi Road, Distt. Saharanpur-247662, Uttar Pradesh (Inst. Id-AYU0551)** inspection was conducted on **08.04.2025** and **09.04.2025** in hybrid mode as a part of annual visitation by the visitation team of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine, NCISM to process **the permission with intake capacity of 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course for the academic session 2025-26 under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020.**
- The visitation report and all other related documents were assessed in terms of enforced regulations namely the Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Undergraduate Ayurveda colleges and Attached Teaching Hospitals Regulations, 2024", provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder. **On careful examination of the assessment report following shortcomings/defects have been observed:-**

i. Teaching staffs:-

- Bio-statistician is not-available.**
- Availability of total teaching staff for UG(BAMS) Course as per the part 1 submitted by the college is $\frac{\text{Available}}{\text{Required}} \times 100\% = \frac{26}{30} \times 100\% = 86.67\%$ (Excluding Excess)**

ii. **Non-teaching staff:-**

a) Availability of Non-Teaching staff is $\frac{\text{Available}}{\text{Required}} \times 100\% = \frac{24}{25} \times 100\% = 96\%$.

iii. **Hospital staffs:-**

a) Availability of hospital staff is $\frac{\text{Available}}{\text{Required}} \times 100\% = \frac{55}{56} \times 100\% = 98.21\%$.

- 3) Further, an opportunity of clarification vide letter even no. dated 17.07.2025 was provided to you. In response of the same you have submitted the clarification vide ref no. DAEIH/CH/25/07/179 Dated 19.07.2025. The submitted documents were verified & found not complying.
- 4) Further, the assessment report along with clarification was duly placed in the 136th Board meeting of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) held on 24.07.2025 and Board observed that the college is not fulfilling the notified & requisite criteria for issuance of permission as per the Concerned Acts and regulations and also observed that college is not fulfilling the criteria in accordance with the Board's policy letter issued on 09.01.2025 & 20.01.2025 in UG (BAMS) course. Further the Board also observed that the college is not fulfilling the criteria for Extended Permission in accordance with regulation 54(2) of Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Undergraduate Ayurveda colleges 2024, as 3rd Renewal of Permission was issued to the college, for the academic year 2024-25. However, Board decided to issue yearly permission in accordance with regulation 54 (3) of Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Undergraduate Ayurveda colleges 2024, under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 as per the approved Seat Reduction Policy approved in 122nd Board meeting of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) on 14.05.2025 in accordance of Section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act 2020 for failing to maintain the minimum essential standards for the Academic year 2025-26, wherein it is mentioned that:-

As per the seat reduction policy 2025-26:-

- a) "For deficiency of every one teacher, seat reduction in the intake capacity shall be considered by reducing the intake strength by 5 % of total intake capacity."

Further, as per Board's policy letter for assessment of Ayurveda colleges issued on 09.01.2025 & 20.01.2025 "The 10% Relaxation in the requirement of the teaching staff may be extended for the Academic year 2025-26. Therefore, the colleges with 60 and 100 intake capacity shall have minimum of 27 and 40 teaching staff respectively fulfilling the requirements of the individual departments separately"

Accordingly, there is deficiency of 01 teacher for issuance of Yearly Permission for academic session 2025-26 under Section 28 of NCISM Act 2020. Therefore, in accordance of seat reduction policy 2025-2026, for deficiency of one teacher, seat reduction in the intake capacity shall be considered by reducing the intake strength by 5% of total intake capacity.

Hence, after applying the seat reduction policy 2025-26 under section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act 2020, college is fulfilling the basic eligibility criteria for issuance of **yearly permission with 57 seats [instead of 60 seats] in UG (BAMS) as per regulation 54(3) of Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Undergraduate Ayurveda colleges 2024.**

"DECISION"

- 5) **Therefore, Dronacharya Ayurvedic Educational Institute & Hospital, Khushalipur, Shakumbari Devi Road, Distt. Saharanpur-247662, Uttar Pradesh (Inst. Id-AYU0551) is hereby granted with :-**


Yearly Permission with seat reduction policy in UG (BAMS) course with intake capacity of 57 seats [instead of 60 seats] in UG (BAMS) for the academic session 2025-26 in accordance with Regulation 54 (3) of Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Undergraduate Ayurveda colleges 2024 and;

- 6) **The aforementioned permission is issued under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 subject to the condition that following requirements shall be fulfilled:-**

- I. It is further informed that minimum **15% of undergraduate seats of the permitted intake capacity of 57 seats [instead of 60 seats]** shall be treated as all India quota. The counseling for seats under all India quota shall be conducted by respective counseling authority as designated by Central Government for A.Y. 2025-26 and counseling for the remaining 85% seats or as the case may be, shall be conducted by the concerned Counseling Authority of that State/UT. **The permission of the college stands withdrawn if the college fails to comply with the aforesaid direction of the Central Government/NCISM for all India quota or the students admitted thereunder.**
 - II. It is also informed that determination of fee and all other charges in respect of 50% of seats in private Medical Institutions and deemed to be University should be as per the guidelines issued by NCISM vide ref no. BUSS/Fee/ASU/2022-23 dated 16.09.2022. Fees of the remaining 50% of seats are to be fixed as per the guidelines of Fee Fixation/Regulatory Committee (FRC) of respective State/UT/Deemed to be University.
- 7) Admissions made in violation of the above conditions will be treated as invalid and action will be initiated under NCISM Act & Regulations thereunder.
- 8) **Further, as per Sub-section (7) of Section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020, The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine may conduct evaluation and assessment of any University or medical institution at any time, either directly or through any other expert, having integrity and experience in medical profession, without any prior notice and assess and evaluate the performance, standards and benchmarks of such University or medical institution and if the college is found to be not maintaining the Minimum Essential standards as specified in the concerned Acts & Regulations then in accordance of Section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act, 2020 the issued permission of the college shall deemed to be withdrawn and denial of permission shall be issued by MARBISM for stoppage of admission for that particular academic year or the subsequent year.**
- 9) Discrepancies, if any, may be immediately brought to the notice of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine, NCISM.
- 10) You are hereby instructed to comply with all the requirements of Aadhaar Enabled Biometric Attendance System as mentioned in the Implementation letters vide. ref. no. 3/2024/MARB/AEBAS & HMS. Dated 09.05.2024 & 06.09.2024 issued by the Board.
- 11) **The following requirements must be fulfilled and the compliance report must reach the Board by 31st December, 2025 to be considered for the issuance of permission for the academic session 2026-2027:-**
- i) All the requirements under the provisions of the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations made thereunder should be fulfilled.
 - ii) All the requirements of Minimum Standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in NCISM (Minimum essential standards, assessment and rating for undergraduate Ayurveda colleges and attached teaching hospitals) Regulations, 2024.
 - iii) All the requirements of the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine (Minimum Standards of Undergraduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations-2022.
 - iv) The shortcoming mentioned in Para no. 2 above, shall be fulfilled.

- 12) The fulfillment of the conditions given above may be made within the time period specified and compliance report should be submitted by the college within the timeline as mentioned above to the President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine. The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine will verify that the conditions have been fulfilled for considering the permission for the academic session 2026-27.
